Open House #1 (Indigenous and Public) consisted of virtual and in-person sessions, held on the 14th and 15th September in Thunder Bay, Ontario. Over the two days, 49 people attended the in-person and 291 joined virtually. The in-person Open Houses included a presentation, panels for discussion with team members, the project newsletter, and a survey.

The feedback received included a number of people who wanted to see this project move forward more quickly, people who wished to understand more about the project, and those who were concerned about impacts to the environment, social impacts and impacts on traditional lands. We have updated FAQs on the website to address some of the questions we received, and they will be considered in the Draft ToR.
